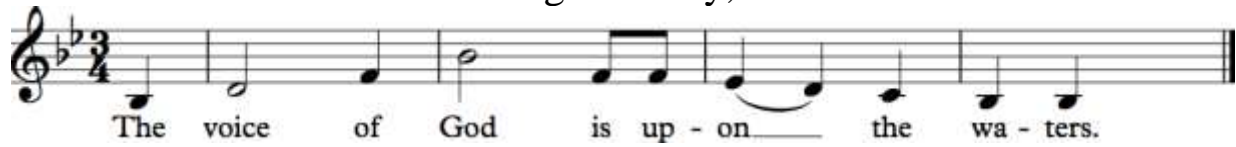

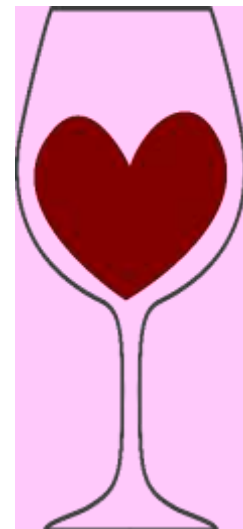


Family Promise Support
