A FRESH LOOK UPDATE: 85 FPC families so far have committed a total of \$550,000 to the three-year *Fresh Look* campaign – for which we all are exceedingly grateful! As the preliminary estimate for the *Fresh Look* improvements is approximately \$850,000, we are hopeful that even more FPC families will challenge themselves to pledge what they can to the *Fresh Look* campaign on top of their already generous giving to FPC’s operating budget. That will reduce both the amount we will need to borrow and our debt burden for several years beyond the three-year *Fresh Look* campaign.

We hope to update you all soon on further pledge results, and on the construction contractor’s estimate and timeline for making the *Fresh Look for a Welcoming Church’s* building improvements a reality. Again, thanks for all the ways you continue to contribute to the missions and needs of Farragut Presbyterian Church!

Children	Education Wing	Pre-K and Elementary classes use <i>Whirl</i> , where children practice reading the Bible and discerning what God is saying to them thru a fun DVD enhanced curriculum.

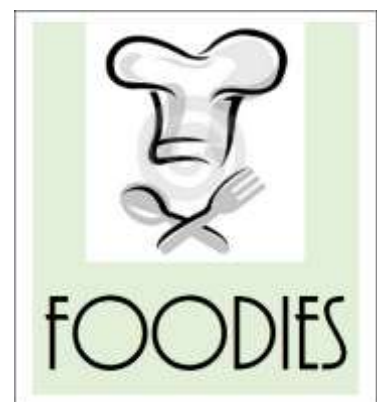
