A **5th Sunday Offering** will be held next week with all the proceeds given to the *Restoration House* in Knoxville. This non-profit group helps single mothers and their children through supportive transitional housing, ally teams, and family advocacy. The existing transitional housing complex, known as The Village, consists of 6 single-housing units, a community center, playground and basketball court. Plans are in place to expand the capacity to 24 housing units serving 150 single parents and 300 children over the next 10 years. Our offering collection next week will be directed entirely to support this Phase II expansion. Let's help them make their dreams a reality!

The Outreach Committee's Back-to-School Giving Tree is in the narthex today. Help give 32 needy children the clothes and school supplies they need to start classes in August.
