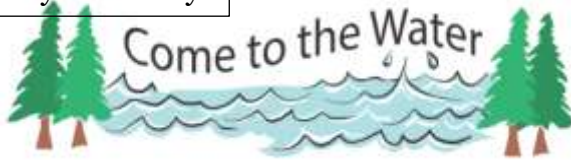

As in previous years, we request that all winter coats be delivered to any locations of KARM Stores or Prestige Cleaners.

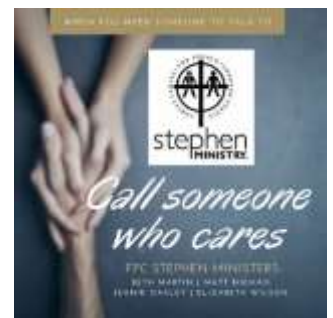
