A Message from our Pastor



#### Christ the Solid Rock

A few years ago, several church members donated money for a large rock outside the office doors of the church. It sits in the berm, along with the other plantings and adds beauty to the church's landscape. The rock has water flowing from it. The sound of it is soothing and reparative.

No matter what is happening outside—worship on a nice Sunday morning, the darkness of night, the wind of a thunderstorm, or the cold of winter—the water flows from this large rock that will not be moved.

As the seasons of our lives change, there is also a rock that will not be moved: Jesus Christ. He famously told the Gospel story of a man who built his house upon a rock, rather than sand. Amid the storm, his was the one that did not wash away.

Neither will ours when the storm clouds gather, the winds rage, and the waters rise. Christ our rock will always remain.

Amid the storms of war, gun violence, illness, and broken relationships, Jesus remains for us—comforting, propping up, and leading us out of the dark valleys. So also does he serve as a beacon of light and strength for the church.

The famous hymn, "The Church's One Foundation," says it well:

"Mid toil and tribulation, and tumult of her war, she waits the consummation of peace forever more; till with the vision glorious her longing eyes are blest, and the great church victorious shall be the church at rest."

On Christ the solid rock we stand. Thanks be to God.




#### **Prayer Shawl Ministry**



Are you a reader? -- One of the "old fashioned" kind, who likes to hold an actual book in your hand? If so, here is a suggestion: give our church library a visit. Of course everyone knows that FPC has a library, since so many committees meet there. But perhaps many don't know that it isn't just a resource for Spiritual study and growth. While there are many commentaries, translations, and books on philosophy, ethics, theology, and other Christian topics, they are only a small part of what is available. There are books that have fun plots as well as non-fiction that covers many current important topics that affect our daily lives. There are children's books, youth literature, and even some DVD's.

FPC has benefitted through the years from some dedicated volunteers. Many years ago, former member Jackie Smith began the effort to bring interesting library books out for the congregation to browse before and after the service, and librarian David Stutzenberger has revived that practice. Each month he will be highlighting FPC books on specific topics in the rolling cart. We are also indebted to the organizational skills and volunteer time that the late Cathy Dorman spent in cataloging and arranging our treasure.

Checking out a book is easy. You can either peruse the shelves for a particular book or you can search the FPC Library Data Base that is available on the computer located in the library. The Database is arranged alphabetically both by author and by title and will give you the shelfing number of the material you are seeking. If you want to take the material from the library there is a station under the TV screen where the signed book card is placed, and a box on the lower shelf for returned books.. Here's a thought: when you finish a book you really liked, tell someone! Then they will know to come in and check it out!
