

2023 Year-End Giving Reminders

- To be counted as a **2023** contribution:
 - Checks or cash must be received at FPC or mailed items postmarked by 12/31/23.
 - Donations by credit card are deductible in the year the donor makes the charge (transaction posting date).
 - ACH, EFT, stock transfers or other online donations are deductible in the year the bank transfers the stock or funds to FPC. Please make sure your <u>online giving</u> <u>is initiated</u> by Tuesday, Dec. 26th in time for the transaction to post on Friday, Dec. 29, 2023. The donation confirmation page on our website will confirm the date your account is debited for online giving transactions.
- Don't file your 2023 tax return before receiving your FPC 2023 year-end giving statement, so that you have IRS-compliant documentation of any gifts of cash or checks to FPC that are \$250 or more.
- Year-end donation statements will be mailed by Jan 31st, 2024.

This Week at FPC

WORSHIP NOTES:

The Service of Nine Lessons and Carols is a traditional Christmas service of scripture and music. The lessons tell the story of the coming of Christ, beginning with the reason God sent him into the world: to save sinners. Next, from Isaiah is read the prophecy of the Savior's coming, followed by the beloved passages from the Gospel according to Luke describing his birth and the announcement of his arrival to the shepherds. From the Gospel according to Matthew we hear the story of the wise men, and in the last lesson, St. John describes the mystery of the incarnation of Christ: "The Word was made flesh." During this final lesson, the people stand as a sign of their reverence and awe, and in the last hymn, *O Come, All Ye Faithful*, make reference to the great mystery, singing "Word of the Father, Now in flesh appearing." Also, at the conclusion of the last lesson, candles are lit by all present, symbolizing Christ as the "true light, which enlightens everyone, coming into the world: for us and our salvation.

The nine lessons were originally drawn up in 1880 by the Bishop of Truro, and adapted forty years later at King's College in Cambridge, England, for a new Christmas Eve service. The college was founded in 1440 by King Henry VI, who decided it should have a choir of sixteen boys (called "choristers") and fourteen men (called "choral scholars"). Thus was born the now famous King's College Choir, which exists today in practically the same form. What began for this choir as a simple Christmas Eve has become one of the most popular and renowned of Christian musical traditions. Each year, the choir is heard around the world as it broadcasts its Lessons and Carols from the spectacular King's College Chapel.

Our service today will follow many traditions of the King's College Choir. To signal the start of the service, chimes will ring the hour and the congregation will stand. Then from the back of the church, a single treble voice will begin the story: "One in royal David's city stood a lowly cattle shed." More voices will join in, verse by verse, (see instructions printed above each verse), until the entire church sings together. At the head of the procession will go an acolyte with a candle lighter, held high as a symbol of the light Christ brings into our world and as a reminder of our purpose in offering up this service of celebration of his birth.
