




Our 2024 Lenten Series is "Wandering Heart – Figuring out Faith with Peter"

• <u>Childrens Preparedness</u> 10 am - Jenny Trussell and friends will be teaching the "Prepare with Pedro the Penguin" program designed to teach children how to BE PREPARED and TAKE ACTION for home fires or local hazards (such as weather events). The 30 minute program is specifically for children in Pre-K – 2nd grade (older children, visitors, and parents are welcome to attend).
