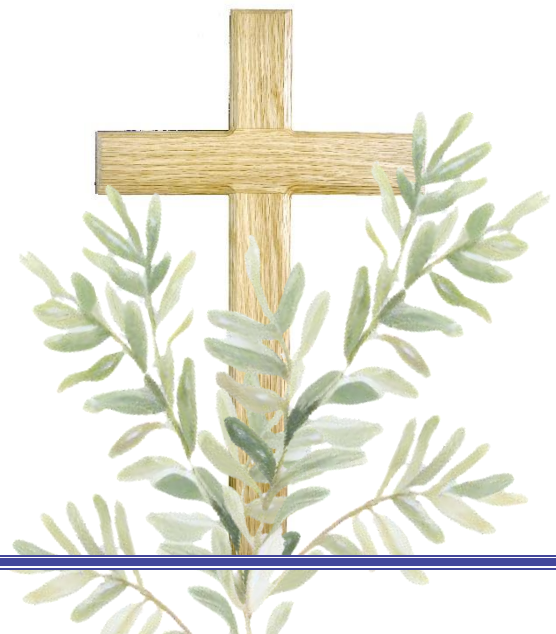

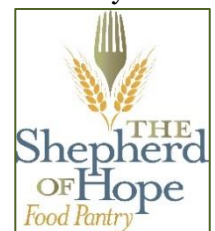
SUNSET GAP HAT/MITTEN TREE:
