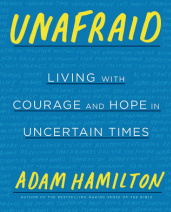

Paul Johnson, a member of FPC, is an instructor for the AARP Smart Driver Class. A number of years ago this class was held once a year at the church, but since the West Knox County Senior Center opened just down the street from FPC, Paul is only holding classes there. This safety driving classroom course meets over two days (Thursday and Friday, usually near the end of each month) for four hours each day from 11:00 AM–3:00 PM. Class fee is \$20 if you're an AARP member or \$25 if you are not an AARP member. The smart driver class explores effective safe-driving practices, skills and strategies you can use on the road every day. It also covers defensive driving techniques to help you deal with aggressive drivers, and more! Seating is limited for this class. Registration is required. Please call the West Knox County Senior Center at 865-288-7805 to inquire about available classes and to sign up to attend.
