





Paul Johnson, a member of FPC, is an instructor for the AARP Smart Driver Class at the West Knox County Senior Center. This safety driving classroom course meets over two days (Thursday and Friday, usually near the end of each month) for four hours each day from 11:00 AM-3:00 PM. Driver Safety Class fee is \$20 if you're an AARP member or \$25 if you are not an AARP member.

The smart driver class explores effective safe-driving practices, skills and strategies you can use on the road every day. It also covers defensive driving techniques to help you deal with aggressive drivers, and more! Seating is limited for this class. Registration is required. Many individuals get a discount on their auto insurance for successfully completing the class.
