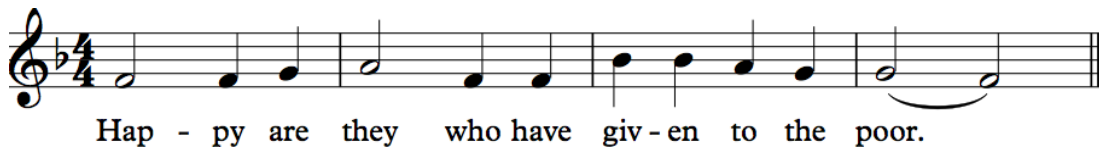

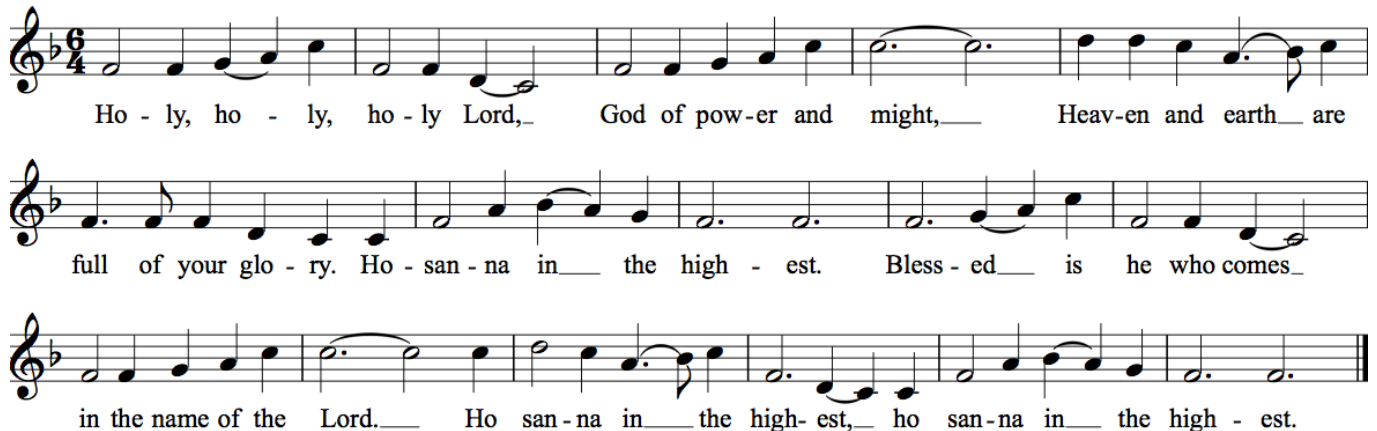

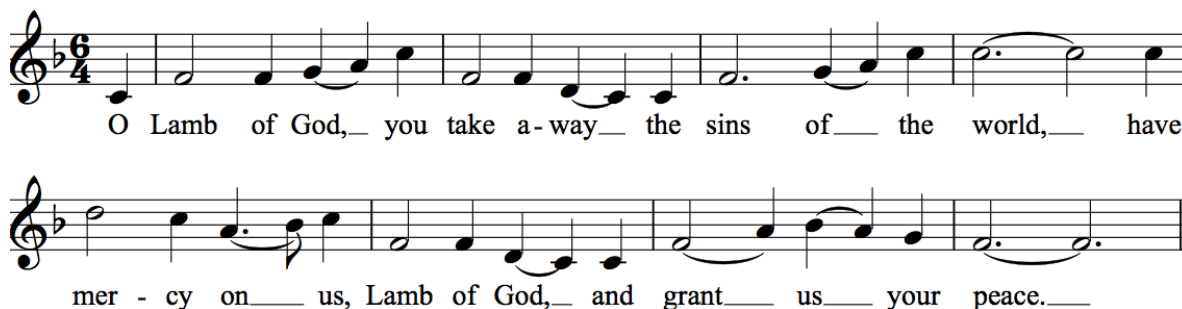

Horizon 2035 Update

Plan Progress Since May 2025

Overview and Purpose

- *Horizon 2035* is a visioning and readiness initiative shaped by months of input from Session, church leadership, and the entire congregation.
 - The plan was adopted by Session in late April 2025, with immediate implementation commencing.
 - Copies of the plan were made available to the congregation.
 - *Horizon 2035* is *not a rigid formula or recipe*, but a *living framework* designed to:
 - Reflect FPC's unique identity and values
 - Respond to emerging opportunities
 - Catalyze a vibrant, missional future

Plan Activities and Implementation

Horizon Implementation Team

- A dedicated Horizon Implementation Team was created to communicate updates, provide accountability and foster progress to plan.
- Updates are provided - both formal and informal, via multiple reports to Session, congregational written and oral updates, and conversations with Implementation Team members.
- Implementation Team members are: Thomas Feldhausen, Sharon Koch, Lynn Kzos, Matt Nieman, John Sharp and Jeff Thode

Planning, Tracking, and Infrastructure

- Developed a fully functional Gantt Chart to track implementation progress, and ongoing development of a church health and mission dashboard.
 - Evaluation of activities, schedules and resources that align with mission, identity and best practice. New activities such as “Narthex Nibbles” after the second service, the Christmas Memorial service, and *Lunch & Learn* are a few examples.
 - Successfully onboarded a Director of Christian Formation.
 - Input to Session and church leadership relative to needs and opportunities identified by *Horizon 2035* that might be addressed in Fresh Look II initiative.

Vision Launch and 40th Anniversary Celebration

Six-Week Vision Launch – Summer 2025

- Dates established and observed for a six-week vision emphasis and 40th birthday celebration.
- Weekly worship focused on themes aligned with the church's mission.
- “*Love & Learn*” was adopted as missional expression of FPC's purpose.
- Created an updated church emblem designed by in-house artists.
- Published a “Telling Our Story” explanation of the new emblem.

- Developed and distributed new identity brochures detailing the mission and activities of the church. These are available in pew racks and throughout the church – members being encouraged to invite and welcome new participants.

Celebration Highlights

- Hands-on mission project during “Love the World” Sunday: with hundreds of meals prepared and approximately 90 participants. These “Meals with a Mission” outreach events will continue in 2026.
 - New Sunday class announced on “Learn” Sunday.
 - 40th birthday celebration (July 13) with baptisms, interviews with charter members and over 160 luncheon attendees.

Quest: Christian Formation and Discipleship

Quest Structure and Offerings

- Developed unique framework for Christian formation at FPC, and published *Quest* class menus for ongoing and new offerings. Menu will be updated and published at least twice annually.
- Children and youth ministries are developing structures aligned with the *Quest* theme and scope.

Adult Formation Initiatives

- **Young Adult Small Group** - Launched August 17 after consultation with young adult leaders. New groups will form on an “on demand” basis.
- **Soul Café:** - Class began July 20 with ongoing attendance of around 20.
- **Pastor’s Class** - Continues as a core Quest offering with robust participation.
- **Additional Classes have included** - *You, an Owner’s Manual*, C.S. Lewis/Narnia class (part of ongoing Thursday evening class online) and *Lunch & Learn* which launched January 15 with about 36 participants.

Upcoming Opportunities

- **The Fifth Gospel** – Starts 2/9/26 at 5:30 pm in Room A. This will be a lively “virtual” trip through the land of the Bible – deepening understanding of the context and meaning of our faith by *experiencing* the story that the land and its culture are telling. A perfect way to observe Lent and prepare for Easter!
 - **Elemental** – Conversations in science and faith at FPC, launches on 2/12/26 at 7:00 pm in Room A. This initial event features biology professor and author Drew Crain. Future events will include reading groups, featured presenters and topics of current interest. Invite your friends and colleagues!
 - **Israel Trip** – February of 2027. Come to the information meeting on Monday, February 9th at 6:30 in Room A for much more on this.
