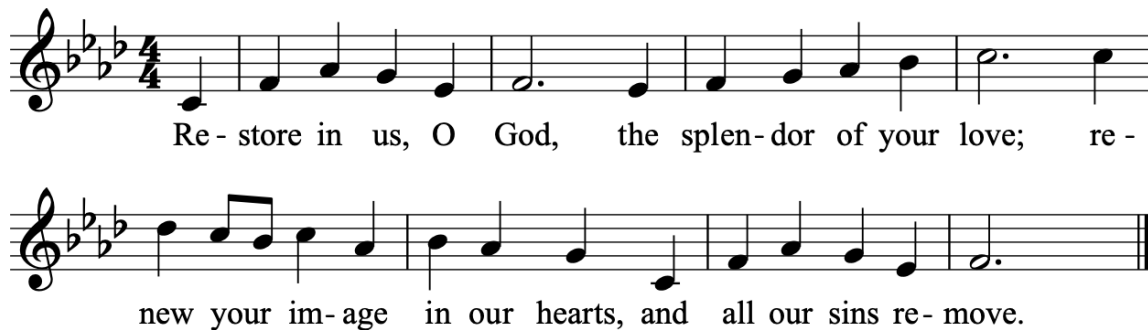
**Create in us clean hearts, O God,

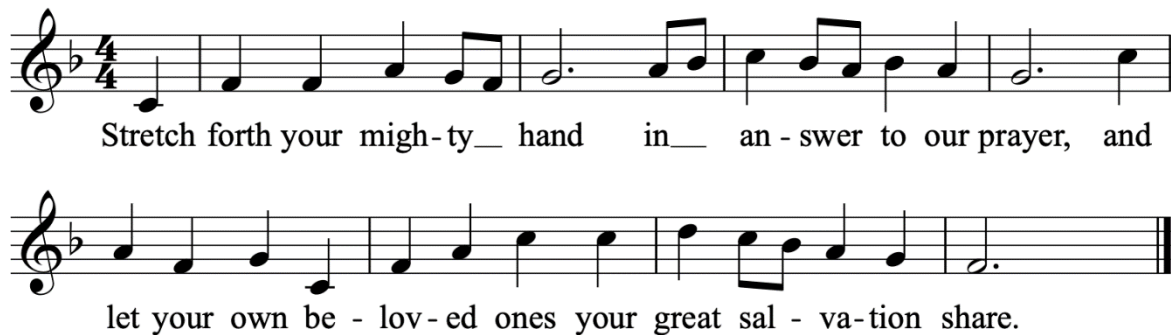



THURSDAY EVENING BIBLE STUDY: Join us for the finish line!

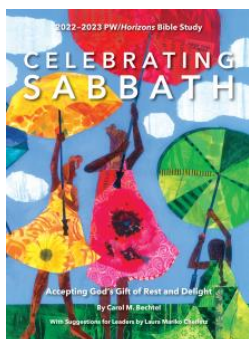

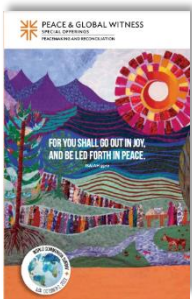
